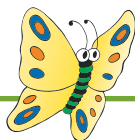

Consisting of an oral language component and a pre-literacy component, *preLAS Online* enables you to capture and hold the attention of young children with playful activities and colorful materials that help you assess language proficiency, and identify instructional placement.

***preLAS Online*:**

- May be used to assess students ages 3 to 6
- Provides assessments in English and Spanish
- Produces test results that may be used to:
 - Identify incoming students
 - Place second language learners in appropriate classroom settings
 - Monitor student progress along the stages of language acquisition (English and Spanish)
 - Report language acquisition/skills in early childhood dual language programs

Implementation of preLAS Online Made Easy!

Launched through the DRC INSIGHT Portal, preLAS Online includes all forms of preLAS (English C, D, and Español C). Once purchased, Districts will see preLAS Online in their dropdown menu in the DRC INSIGHT Portal.

ADMINISTERING preLAS ONLINE

To test a student, the Test Administrator will click on the DRC INSIGHT application icon on the testing device, enter in the username and password from the test ticket, and interview the child (**due to age, the child does not take the test online**).

- Test Administrators will need a cue picture book to prompt the student. Cue picture books can be purchased à la carte, as needed.

- As the student provides answers/responses, instead of the Test Administrator bubbling these on the student answer document, the Test Administrator will click on the answer choices of Correct/Incorrect/No Response for parts 1–4 of the Oral Assessment and items 1–25 of the Pre-Literacy Assessment (if utilized).

- Part 5 of the Oral Assessment called Let's Tell Stories, which are items that are holistically scored, Test Administrators will listen to the student and click the appropriate score based on the rubric.

- Once the test is complete and submitted by the Test Administrator, a Student Proficiency Report will be available within 30–60 minutes.
